



## GEAR LIST

**\*Ounces count for all hunts so please pack accordingly**

- Sheep/Goat
  - 15 degrees waterproof down or synthetic sleeping bag (don't overthink this but most people prefer waterproof down due to the weight and compressibility)
  - 100% waterproof drybag for sleeping bag
  - Waterproof bivy (depending on your guide you may use a tarp to sleep under vs. a tent some nights as they are more convenient to find places to set up)
  - Insulated sleeping pad
    - There are many of these on the market but try to find one with a mummy shape that is wide and long enough to accommodate you. Thermarest neo air is a great option
  - Backpack at least 6K cubic inches in size, we recommend Barneys Pinnacle Pack
  - Ball cap and warm Beanie
  - Sunglasses
  - 1 synthetic t-shirt short or long sleeve
  - 1 base layer top
  - 1 medium weight top like a fleece
  - 1 warm down/synthetic puffy jacket
  - 1 Gore-Tex gloves insulated
  - 1 liner / lightweight gloves
  - 1 Gore-Tex rain jacket (need to be of high quality as there are different levels)
  - 1-2 Pairs synthetic boxers, we don't recommend going commando style out there
  - 1 base layer bottoms
  - 1 softshell hunting pants
  - 1 Gore-Tex rain pants (need to be of high quality as there are different levels)
  - 1 Boot Gators
  - 1 pair of broken in boots synthetic or leather
    - Crispi
    - Kennetrek
    - Hanwag
    - Scarpa

- These are just a few that work for people and boots are a very personal fit. What may fit one may not fit another. Please make sure they are broken in.
- Minimum 3 pairs wool socks
- Lightweight cup
- Lightweight spoon
- 1 pair Collapsible trekking poles
- Knife
- Binoculars with harness
- Nalgene bottle and/or camel bak
- Additional water storage for at least 4L (can be platypus water bags)
- Thermarest ISOMAT (for sitting on glassing and additional insulation under sleeping pad)
- Small basic med kit with leukotape for hot spots on feet (you don't need a whole roll)
- Bright head lamp w/extra batteries/or power source
- Bug head w/ no-see-um size holes
- Smallest bottle of 100% deet
- Dry bags for clothing to go in
- Rifle w/ sling
- Soft rifle case (optional and will be left in the vehicle at the trailhead)
- 40 rounds of your ammunition (we will site in all rifles prior to your hunt, and we never know how the airlines treat our luggage, so this is in case your scope was knocked around in transport)
- Lighter/fire starter
- Ear plugs for shooting (or to give your guide if you snore)
- Baby wipes
- Chapstick
- Phone w/battery bank to recharge (you will take lots of pictures)
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Crocs for camp and crossing streams
- Electrolytes of your choice these can be very important for some more than others
- Book for reading if weathered in
- Optional sheep hunting items
- Vest
- Spotting scope
- Tripod
- Personal snack items
